Its aims are 'to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical intellectual social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of the local, national and international communities particularly by the provision of specialised outdoor activities.

After two years without an Apex Challenge event, this one was always going to feel particularly special and from the moment teams arrived the sense of excitement was clear.

Teams were pitching tents, studying maps, planning strategies and getting ready for the weekend. Old Apex friends were reunited as music played across the bustling campsite.

400 keen adventurers packed into the marquee for the first of the weekend's briefings and straight after that the action began with a challenging sprint version of the main event. With just 70 minutes to hunt down 15 well-hidden control points strewn over the Bramham Park estate in the pitch darkness, it took great navigation skills, determination and endurance to succeed.

And teams weren't alone. An army of highly trained Apex Chasers out to hunt teams down and take their points away. As teams returned, soaked and exhausted, the marquee was plunged into red light whenever a team returned which had been chased and caught.

Saturday gave teams a full six hours to collect as many points as possible, Activities ranged from kayaking across an open lake, to mountain biking down sheer slopes and hurling axes – so teams needed to be adaptable to make the most of what was on offer.

And all the time, seconds were ticking away and it was those who used clever route planning with endurance and determination who came out on top.

The legendary giant Apex parrot was out throughout the event as teams tried to track him down to secure the substantial 75 point reward.

As teams gathered at Event Centre, they got the latest scores at the results update. It was also becoming clear

what was ahead on Sunday. But before all that it was Saturday Night Live. Competitors danced into the night to the sounds of "The Epics" playing two fantastic live sets on stage. Wild dancing and crowd surfing made for an unforgettable night.

This year brought us the toughest ever Apex Adventure Race. The 5km course took in woodland tracks, steep slopes, boggy swamps and thick forest, but dotted along the route were more than a dozen new obstacles. From crawls under 'barbed' wire to wet river crossings, water sprays, spiders' webs and intense muddy crawls this tested the endurance of event the fittest competitors.

All in all it was once again a fantastic weekend in a stunning location.

Some 2022 facts and figures

- 392 young people took part in the event.
- It was made possible because of the work of 74 dedicated volunteers.
- The Apex Adventure Race was actually 5.1 km long, with 66 metres of height gain.
- 36 of the 98 teams managed to track down Paddy the Parrot.
- Incredibly, there were just 4 points separating the top two teams in the Explorers competition this year.



The Apex Challenge started the financial year in 2022 following several years of financial challenges. The charity last held an event in 2019, a year in which some unexpected financial expenses were incurred. During 2020 and 2021 the charity also had some ongoing annual costs to pay, without any income. It was important to address these financial issues during 2022.




A full event has enabled us to make a profit of £1930 on a total event cost of £21,648.

£600 of site hire fees were paid in 2020 and carried over as a deposit for this year's site hire. We also received a donation of £600. This means the profit accounted for is more than the reality of the situation.

Because this is the final Apex Challenge event, the remaining bank balance will be transferred to South Yorkshire County Scouts and the bank account closed.

Thank you to everyone who has supported us over an amazing 20 years.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

I report on the accounts of Apex Challenge for the year ended 31 December 2022 which comprise the 'Statement of receipts and payments' set out on page 3 of the annual report.

This report is made solely to the trustees in accordance with Section 145 of the Charities Act 2011. My work has been undertaken so that I might state to the charity's trustees those matters I am required to state to them in an Independent Examiner's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, I do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charity and the charity's trustees for my examination work.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The Apex Challenge trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. They consider that an audit is not required for this year under Section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed. It is my responsibility to:

- Examine the accounts under Section 145 of the Charities Act
- Follow the procedures laid down in the general directions given by the Charity Commissioners (under Section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act), and
- State whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiners' report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the Apex Challenge and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
